#### From Dean's desk

The twin institutes of the Seth GS Medical College and KEM hospital were established in 1926 with a nationalistic spirit to cater to the "health care needs of the northern parts of the island" to be manned entirely by Indian doctors. With a glorious legacy of over 80 years, 10 lakh patients and 50,000 plus surgeries annually, these institutes are amongst the top ranked in the country and city with the Latin maxim "Non sibi sed Omnibus"- not for self, but for all", embedded in every heart.

The year 2013 was marked by several achievements. New equipment and services that aided patient care were made possible through funds from the municipal corporation, government agencies and munificent donations of individuals and trustees- deep brain stimulation was started for patients with Parkinson's disease, a new rural health training center was established at Pise-Panjrapur, a clinic for families of patients with lysosomal storage disorders was started, a liver transplant outpatient clinic was started as also an outpatient pain clinic. The department of plastic surgery organized the "Camp Karma" for children who were burn survivors, while the department of cardiology established a whats app mobile application whereby ECGs of patients with chest pain are viewed by senior faculty on a whats app care group. The departments of Nephrology and Urology performed a renal transplant successfully on a patient who was HIV positive. The department of Endocrinology established an ambassador exchange program with an institute from the United States, and several departments received recognition from the Medical Council of India. Postgraduate students won several awards and travel scholarships. Several faculty members initiated new fellowships in their departments under the aegis of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and several students successfully cleared the fellowship exams. Numerous conferences and CMEs were organized and a large number of papers published.

Where do we go from here? Plans for 2014 are already gathering momentum. Another Cath lab and a ECHO-color Doppler machine are in the pipeline, a foot care service clinic for patients with diabetes, setting up of a liver ICU, bariatric surgery, expansion of the cadaver donation program, a neurovascular laboratory, computer navigation assisted spinal surgery and arthroplasty, setting up of new modular OTs, several new fellowships, teaching innovations and much more. It is hoped that these developments will constructively change the institutes for the betterment of patients, greater efficiency of its enormous staff, and help sound training of its students and resident medical doctors, not to forget the support staff, nursing school and her alumni. At the end of the day, however as several thousand patients walk through these hallowed portals each year with hope in their hearts, it will remain our primary responsibility to ensure that they get the best medical care from kind, caring and compassionate physicians- hands that comfort, soothe and heal. In the words of Bob Dole, "when it is all over, its not who you were. It's whether you made a difference.

# Gastroenterology

- The Liver transplant OPD was started in collaboration with GI surgery services; this OPD is run on Monday afternoon.
- The Liver ICU construction has been completed. This 6-bedded unit will cater to patients with liver failure due to various causes, and also for care during the post-transplant period.
- Organized a GI motility workshop on October 25, 2013. This was the first such workshop held in India.

#### **GI Surgery**

# Microbiology

• Patient care

The NABL accreditation for HIV antibody detection using rapid and ELISA formats, CD4 count estimation, HCV antibody detection by ELISA, HBsAg detection by ELISA and RPR test has been successfully renewed for 2013-2014. The department has performed consistently well in the EQAS administered by Indian Association of Medical Microbiologists which includes bacteriology, mycobacteriology, mycology and serology. The department also participates in EQAS for mycology conducted by the national reference laboratory for the same. The department has procured through a benevolent donor, GeneXpert equipment and Xpert MTB/RIF assay for same day diagnosis of both TB and Rif resistance. Currently recognized by the national programme (RNTCP), this equipment will benefit rapid screening of MDRTB suspects. This test is available free of cost for patients with suspected pulmonary MDRTB and all HIV seropositive suspected PTB co-infected patients. The department has also procured through the same donor Vitek2 for providing MIC results for seriously ill patients with culture proven bacterial infection. Antifungal susceptibility testing for yeast is currently available.

The department recently introduced a syndrome centred approach as the crux of undergraduate training bringing about a paradigm shift from organisms to infectious diseases and their aetiology. Dr Preeti Mehta and her team successfully implemented National Knowledge Network Connectivity with KEM Hospital Intranet .

#### **Radiology**

• Annually, over 1,80,000 patients visit the Radiology Department for various Diagnostic as well as Interventional treatment. It boasts of the latest and sophisticated 1.5 Tesla MRI, 64-slice CT Scan, Mammography (for Breast Cancer Screening), Ultrasonography and Doppler machines. Peripheral Vascular and Neurovascular Minimally Invasive Interventions are carried out on a Bi-planar DSA machine. Conventional imaging is carried out on 5 Digital Radiography (DR) units as well as on CR units. Facility for Radiofrequency Ablation (RFA) of tumors is available here. Endovenous Laser Therapy (EVLT) is done here to treat patients with varicose veins.

#### **Transfusion Medicine**

- Dr Jayashree Sharma passed the NABH Assessor course and has been empanelled as an assessor for carrying out assessment of blood banks/ blood centers by NABH.
- Department awarded NABH Accreditation by NABH-National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Health Care providers, Quality council of India, New Delhi from 22.08.12 to 21.08.2015, first Public Hospital in Maharashtra to get NABH Accreditation.

#### **Urology**

- The department has started offering laparoscopic procedures to our patients. We perform laparoscopic ureterolithotomies, nephrectomies, pyeloplasties, VVF repairs and orchidopexies.
- The department has started the advanced laparoscopic program along with advanced oncology & reconstructive surgical program
- This is the only department in the whole state of Maharashtra which has started and has been regularly performing laparoscopic donor nephrectomy which is consider to be the most difficult and complex urological laparoscopic operation.
- We have also procured Laparoscopy Trainer to train postgraduate students in basic Lap. Procedures before they perform them on patients.
- The department has procured 'Revolix Laser Machine' dual Thullium and Holmium laser for comprehensive management of prostate, bladder cancer & stone surgery
- For patients with erectile dysfunction with failure of conservative therapy, the department offers penile prosthesis at low cost.
- A record number of 44 pediatric PCNL/URS were performed.
- Over 16,500 patients were treated on the all urology OPD's during the year and over 1500 operations were performed including kidney transplantations.

Emergency laboratory services are available after routine hours. Approximately 25000 specimens have been processed in emergency lab. The clinical bacteriology division performs routine detection for methicillin resistance, vancomycin resistance, ESBL, AmpC and carbapenemase. MIC determination is carried out for those antibiotics for which disk diffusion is not recommended. This includes penicillin, vancomycin, colistin, imipenem and meropenem. Digital subtraction angiograms and endovascular neurointerventional procedures are now being performed. Carotid stenting, coiling of aneurysms and treatment of cranial and spinal arteriovenous malformations is being routinely done.

#### **Ophthalmology**

This dept. has an outpatient dept. and operations are being performed in O.T. on all days. It has a special ward for keratoplasty patients. It gives complete Eye care in the form of various Ophthalmic procedures like contact lens, intraocular lens implantation, keratoplasty, fluorescein angiography & vitreo retinal surgery, diagnostic facilities with ultrasound, slit lamp, perimeter are available for out patients nd for these specially referred. There is a well-established "EYE BANK' with facilities for enucleation, storages use of the balls. This dept. is a well-known centre for diseases of the posterior segment of eye. Vitreo Retinal Surgery is regularly done in the dept. Weekly diabetic retinopathy careening activities including fundus photography fluorescein angiography and laser conducted in association with Aditya Jyoti Eye Hospital involving mobile van.

# c) Integrated Disease Surveillance Program:

Daily Disease surveillance is done through IDSP established at KEM Hospital, PSM Dept. for patients with Acute Gastroenteritis, Leptospirosis, Dengue, Malaria and fever cases admitted in KEM Hospital. Epidemiological investigation in the field for these cases are carried out. The disease trend and high risk areas are identified and informed to Epidemiological cell (Kasturba hospital Mumbai) for required action.

The death cases are thoroughly investigated. Health checkup camps are carried out in the vicinity of the outbreak areas by the PSM residents.

The total cases (disease under surveillance) admitted in KEM Hospital this year were 4192.

#### II. Services at Naigaon Health Centre:

Naigaon community is one of field practice areas of the department of PSM. The various activities conducted in the Naigaon community are as follows:

- General OPD (Geriatric Clinic) on every Wednesday & Friday.
   In the year 2013 till date, 1580 patients were examined in the General OPD at Naigaon.

Till 8<sup>th</sup> Dec, 2013, a total of 3082 persons were given the counseling service through helpline. A total of 8 trained counselors are providing the counseling services through helpline initiative.

#### **Transfusion Medicine**

- In addition to the routine services like grouping and cross-matching of 1.5 lakh Blood units per year, Transfusion Medicine provides single Donor Platelets (prepared by plateletpheresis) to patients, particularly to those with hematological disorders, monsoon related illnesses and those undergoing cardiac surgery. Total 7872 units of Random Donor Platelets and about 96 units of Single Donor Platelets (SDP) were issued for the patients.. The need of 150-200 blood units per day for patients admitted in our hospital is fulfilled by about 200-220 blood donation camps in a year with over 38100 blood units collected annually.
- Successful Stem cell apheresis has been performed
- Therapeutic Plasmapheresis has been started in the Department which is beneficial for patients of G.B. Syndrome, Polymyositis Myasthenia Gravis etc.
- Therapeutic phlebotomy has been started which is beneficial for patients of sickle cell anemia, and polycythemia

The Times of India (12th April 2013)- Dust from S Arabia settles as haze in Mumbai

Even as dust haze continued to envelop the city for the third day on Thursday, its density has diminished. This is the second year in a row that such a haze-direct consequence of a dust storm over distant Arabian Peninsula-has visited the city.V K Rajeev, director of weather forecast at Indian Meteorological Department (IMD), Mumbai, said the dust storm, which started on March 24, has been blowing through parts of Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Iraq. "This dust storm was favoured by Westerly winds, which caused it to move across Arabian sea on the west coast, thus affecting places such as Mumbai, Goa and Ratnagiri." The visibility was low on Tuesday; it was reportedly half the normal visibility of 6,000 metres at 3,000m. "The intensity of the haze has eased since Tuesday as the dust mass has been carried away further eastwards. "Last year in March, too, Mumbai had been in the grip of a very high density dust storm. South-westerly air currents had carried the dust from Saudi Arabia to several parts of northern India and then to Mumbai by northerly winds. The MET department, though, had said a sandstorm in Rajasthan was responsible for the haze last year. High pollution levels this time have spelt trouble for those who already suffer from asthma, sinusitis or rhinitis. Neha Khera (38), for instance, was among several Mumbaikars who had problems breathing. Khera, who suffers from asthma, found her symptoms aggravated by Tuesday noon. "By the time I reached my office, I started coughing. By lunch, I had to go to see my doctor."Dr Ashok Mahasur, chest physician at Hinduja Hospital, said, "At such times, we mostly get senior citizens who complain of breathlessness. Even a few students are brought in during exams because of coughing. "A high amount of particulate matter in the air can cause respiratory problems. It is not advisable for chronic respiratory patients to go outdoors," said Dr Amita Athavale, chest specialist at KEM Hospital. "Wearing masks will not help. Patients will have to take extra medications. But the only way to avoid a troublesome bout of wheezing or cough is by staying indoors."

The Times of India: 31st October 2013- ASTHMA PATIENTS IN Diwali dread- Crackers And Smoke Leave Those With Respiratory Problems All Cracked Up During Festive Season

For everyone else, Diwali means celebrations and get-togethers. But for Arjan Manchanda,it means self-imposed solitude. Every Diwali, the 78-year-old confines himself to his room in his sixth-floor-flat, closes all doors and windows and waits for all the celebrations to get over. The asthma patient, wants to shield himself from the smoke of firecrackers. Even though we stay on the sixth floor, the smoke still affects me, said the Mazgaon resident. Asthma keeps many like him away from Diwali. I absolutely avoid going out especially at night during Diwali week, said Vasant Rao (68), a resident of Kings Circle. Due to the weather change, pollution levels rise from October and smoke from crackers means patients who have respiratory disorders get aggravated symptoms and sometimes

an acute attack. We see a 30% rise in respiratory morbidity post-Diwali, said Dr Ashok Mahasur, chest physician at Hinduja Hospital. This time, city doctors are more wary. Since the city has just gone through a flu epidemic, this time the immunity of asthma and bronchitis patients has reduced. If subjected to smoke they are bound to face more problems than usual, said Dr Pramod Niphadkar, a chest physician at St George Hospital. Doctors say anar and chakri are the biggest culprits as they spread a lot of smoke, adding rockets are a better bet. Moreover, any firecrackers should be burst on the terrace or open spaces, where there is adequate ventilation. But it is preferable if asthma patients stay away from crackers completely, said Niphadkar. If possible, the patients should go out of Mumbai, or at least stay away where crackers are being burst, said Nalini Bhelande, chairperson of Asthma and Bronchitis Association of India, a support group of asthma patients. While avoiding the smoke completely may be impossible, those who have problems in Diwali often find it difficult to get doctors, most being on holiday. So patients are advised to be well-prepared. We tell patients to be equipped with emergency medicines and inform them about the dos and don'ts, said Dr Niphadkar. We give special instructions to the emergency ward regarding these patients, said Dr Mahasur. Dr Amita Athavale, head of department of chest medicine at KEM Hospital says avoiding exposure might not be possible. So we tell patients to increase medication dosage. We also teach patients early identification of symptoms so the problem can be controlled before it goes out of hand, said Dr Athavale. People should understand that their short-term celebration affects others in the long term. One can come up with innovative ideas like laser shows to celebrate the festival of lights rather than gifting troubles with fireworks, she added.

# **6.** Hospital Infection Control Committee (HICC)

HICC met seven times in 2013. Dean (G & K) is the chairperson and Dr Gita Nataraj (Prof., Microbiology ) is the convener. The other members include Dr A.R Pazare ( Prof. and Head, Medicine), Dr A.K Gyalani (Prof. and Head, Surgery), Dr Preeti Mehta (Prof. and Head, Microbiology), Dr Ruchi Nanavati (Prof. and Head, Neonatology), Dr P.B. Bhosale (Prof. and Head, Orthopedics), Dr Smita Diwate (Addl. Prof., Pathology), Dr N.M Maydeo (Professor, OBGY), Deputy Dean, Assistant Dean, Matron and representatives from nursing department, Head Clerk (GS), AE (Civil), AE (M & E). With a view to improving the reach of infection control committee and implement its goals it was decided to include as members, (i) heads of all surgical disciplines and anaesthesia in a theatre sub-committee group, (ii) in-charges of intensive care units (iii) chest medicine for facilitating airborne infection control and (iv) identify nursing members exclusively for infection control monitoring. The routine activities include facilitating supply of essential consumables for hand hygiene, theatre disinfection and biomedical waste management, monitoring infection control practices and biomedical waste management with a team consisting of AMO, Asst. Prof (Microbiology), sister in charge as designated and identifying areas for improvement. The microbiology department provided data on bugs and drugs. The committee members participated in healthcare worker training programmes conducted in the months of Feb, March and May 2013. Airborne infection control related facility check was conducted with the designated infection control consultant of MCGM and areas for improvement identified and submitted to engineers. HICC with Microbiology department coordinated the organization and participated in the short course workshop on "building design and engineering approaches to airborne infection control", in September 2013. This workshop was organized by MCGM in collaboration with CDC (USA) and Harvard School of Public Health.

A total of fifty meetings (12 full board meetings, 1 SOP training meeting and 37 SAE Subcommittee meetings) were held in the year 2013.A total of 35 pharmaceutical sponsored projects, 10 government sponsored projects, 49 other academic projects and 52 thesis / dissertations were submitted to the IEC-I for initial review during the year.

None of the Pharmaceutical projects were approved at first submission as there were scientific and ethical lacunae in the submitted protocols. The comments by the IEC-I members, pertaining to modifications in the protocol were sent to investigators. The answers to IEC-I comments were then reviewed and the project was granted approval. #### 13. Telemedicine

The Maharashtra Telemedicine Project was initiated as a collaborative project of Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Govt. of Maharashtra (GoM) and Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai. The project is one of the major initiatives under the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM). The annual budget provided till November 2013 is Rs. 18,76,842/-. The KEM Hospital Telemedicine Center has been connected with Telemedicine Centers at Alibaug, Chandrapur, Karad, Kamathe, Nandurbar, Navapur, Ratnagiri, Sindhudurg, Sawantwadi, Satara, Shahapur and Thane through a satellite link & Broadband connection. The KEM Telemedicine Center is working as a Specialty Center and its doctors are providing expert advice (all specialties and super-specialities) to patients and doctors from these peripheral centers.

The working of the KEM Telemedicine Center is supervised by the KEM Telemedicine Committee: Chairperson: Dr.Sandhya Kamath (Dean)

The day-to-day working of the Center is carried out by Mr. Sandeep Mehendale, the Facility Manager.

During the year, a total of 5,464 patients have derived benefit of expert advice from specialists of KEM Hospital. The disciplines whose opinions have been sought include anesthesiology, ayurvedic medicine, cardiology, cardio-thoracic surgery, chest medicine, dermatology, dentistry, endocrinology, gastro-enterology, gastro-enterology surgery, general medicine, general surgery, gynecology and obstetrics, hematology, neonatology, neurology, neurosurgery, ophthalmology, orthopedics, otorhinolaryngology, pediatric surgery, pediatrics, plastic surgery and radiology. Many departments also use the KEM Telemedicine Centre facilities for scientific lectures and academic communications. Through this program, KEM Hospital and Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai are providing their contribution to promotion of health of Maharashtra's rural populace.

We have seen that wide dissemination of information about the presence, objectives, work of the committee has given confidence to more and more women to come forward and lodge their complaints. The committee approaches the cases with sensitivity and respect for all stakeholders. It follows the MCGM guidelines and Vishakha Guidelines in handling the cases.

#### SUPPORT SERVICES

#### Diet, Linen, Laundry and Tailoring

- The activities start in the early morning at 3.30 a.m. and end at 6.00 p.m. The five subsection viz Kitchen, Diet Store, Linen Store, and Laundry and Tailoring, works in co-operation. All the entries of supply and issue were carried out in SAP system.
- The Head Clerk(Diet & Linen Store) Mr. Anant Gengaje developed a software for Diet Store named "FOOD MANAGER" to keep records of all type of dietary patients admitted in the hospital from which the work like preparing Diet Sheet, Milk Sheet, Chapatti Sheet and Bread Sheet is done within half an hour without any mistake. It also keeps day to day record of vegetable, milk etc. Up gradation of software is also in progress.

#### Kitchen:

- The kitchen has 1 head cook and 25 cooks under the supervision of 2 dieticians with cooperation of diet store provided whole day meal to approx. 2000 admitted patients daily.
- The different types of diet provided include Normal therapeutic diet, Ryle's tube diet and Liquid diet. On the occasion of Special Days such as Independence Day, Diwali, Christmas, Maharashtra Day and Foundation day of hospital, sweet dishes were prepared and served to all the patients.

#### Diet Store:

• The Diet store is being run by 1 Head Clerk, 2 Clerks, 1 Clerk works half day and 3 Hamal. This store prepare summary sheets for whole hospital like Diet sheet, Milk sheet, Chapati sheet and Bread sheet on daily basis and purchased the perishable items like Milk (3,05,260 l), Vegetables (75000 kg), Eggs (2,32,860) and Bread (41,830 packets) from the scheduled contractors as per the summary sheet and receiving the supply of same on daily basis. Nonperishable (stockable) items like Rice (42,000 kg), Dal (26000 kg), and Sugar (10,000 kg) were also purchased by this store from the scheduled contractors as per the requirement.

#### Linen Store:

• The Linen store is being run by 1 Head Clerk, 2 Clerks and 2 Hamals. This store purchased the total quantity of approximately 3,50,000 numbers of bed sheets, patient coat, patient pyjama, surgeon banian, surgeon gown and surgical dressing material such as gauze, bandage cloth, cotton wool and issued as per requirement in the year 2012

#### Laundry:

• The Laundry dept. run by 1 Head Clerk (Common to Diet Store), 1 Clerk, 3 Laundry Assistants and 7 Labours. Daily approx. 4500 numbers of soiled linen used by Patients as well as Doctors from all wards and theatres are collected and sent to Municipal Power Laundry as well as Private Dhobi through this department for washing and ironing. Approx 54,000 numbers of cloths were washed and ironed in the year 2012. Approximately 8000 cloths were received as condemned from various wards and theatres.

#### Tailoring:

• The Tailoring department is being run by 1 Head Clerk (Common to Diet Store), 1 Head Tailor, 4 Tailors and 1 Peon. Approximately 30,000 numbers of repairable torn cloths of patients and doctors were sewn.

## **Engineering (Mechanical and Electrical)**

 Operation & Maintenance of Mechanical and electrical equipment such as Generators, Central Air conditioning plants, Lifts, Medical Gases, Central Oxygen & Nitrous oxide supply system, central suction, central compressed air, central L.P.G., firefighting system, EPABAX system & about 300 computer along with its peripherals, PA SYSTEM, AMC/CMC of all types of Medical equipment's are the various activities that are looked after by this department.


