#### **ANNUAL REPORT – 2019**

## I. Highlights & Achievements:

- "Psychological First Aid Workshop" was conducted on 10<sup>th</sup> July 2019. It was conducted by Dr. Shubhangi Parkar, Professor and Head of the Department of Psychiatry at KEMH along with Dr. Shilpa Adarkar Professor, Department of Psychiatry at KEMH. Thirty-eight (38) undergraduate students attended from various discipline attended this workshop.
- Workshop on "Narrative writing and Reflections" was conducted 19<sup>th</sup> of July 2019. The students were introduced to the concepts of narrative writing in medicine and how to reflect. This workshop was conducted by Dr. Padmaja Samant, Professor, Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology, Dr. Munira Hirkani, Professor, Department of Physiology, KEMH and Dr. Henal Shah, Professor, Department of Psychiatry at Nair Hospital.
- World Bioethics Day Celebrations The World Bioethics Day 2019 Celebrations started with various competitions for undergraduate students on the theme of World Bioethics Day 2018- "Respect for Cultural Diversity in Healthcare". The celebrations culminated into the mega event held on Monday, 14<sup>th</sup> October 2019. Dr Armida Fernandez, renowned Neonatologist, Former Dean of Sion Hospital; chief guest on this occasion, delivered a key note address on the theme, "Respect for Cultural Diversity in Health".
- The Symposium on the theme "Respect for Cultural Diversity in Healthcare" was arranged on 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2019 as a part of World Bioethics Day Celebrations. There were three invited guest speakers Dr Jayita Deodhar, Professor of Psychiatry & Palliative care, Tata Memorial Hospital, Mrs. Sujata Ashtekar, Organ Donation Coordinator & Consultant and Ms Surabhi Mittal, IIT Mumbai. They touched upon different aspects related to cultural diversity and healthcare.
- **Publication** Annual bulletin of the unit, "INARCH" based on the theme "Respect for Cultural Diversity in Healthcare" was released during the World Bioethics Day celebration on 14<sup>th</sup> October 2019. Dr Padmaja Samant was the editor of this bulletin.

II. Education: GSMC MUHS UNESCO Bioethics unit conducts training for undergraduate students across various disciplines in accordance with the syllabus designed by MUHS and UNESCO chair, Haifa. As per MCI directives, the 'Bioethics sessions as a part of Foundation Course' were conducted during 3rd August 2019 to 23rd August 2019 for the new batch of 250 First MBBS students. There were 7 sessions which covered the competencies addressed under the theme 'Professionalism and Ethics'. The modules are conducted by trained members and experts in the field.
