





Report of World Bioethics Day 2020 Celebrations Theme: Benefit and Harm GSMC MUHS UNESCO Unit Seth GS Medical College and KEM Hospital, Mumbai, INDIA

The GSMC MUHS UNESCO Bioethics Unit celebrated the **World Bioethics Day** on Monday, 19th October 2020 along with a weeklong celebration prior. This year the pandemic had us in a new normal way of celebrations with a lot of new learning and resilience. The World Bioethics Day 2020 began with the strong student wing that carrying out various activities based on the theme of World Bioethics Day 2020 'Benefit and Harm'.

Due to the current situation of COVID 19, all competitions were held online/offline mode on virtual platforms. Students were involved in planning, organizing and execution of these events. Experts from outside and within the institute were invited as judges.

- ❖ Poster making Competition 2020: Poster making competition was held on the theme 'Benefit and Harm'. All the participants were instructed to submit soft copy of their poster on mail. Total 38 registrations were received. There were 11 registrations from Seth GSMC & KEMH and remaining 27 were from other MCGM colleges.
- Photography Competition 2020: 08 entries were received. It was kept open for undergraduate students, postgraduate students and employees of MCGM colleges. The wnning photographs were felicitated.
- ❖ JIGYASA 'Ethical Reflections on the COVID 19 Pandemic' 2020: This was an attempt to tender young minds in nurturing and understanding research. They were given four articles related to various ethical challenges during the pandemic for critically appraising. The participants presented a summary of the article, its strong points and weak points. They were asked to imagine they were writing an original







bioethics paper and what was the single most ethical challenge they would focus on. This was followed by question answer session from the judges. Total 12 registrations were received from the undergraduate students of Seth GSMC & KEMH.

❖ STORY TELLING Competition 2020: This was based on this year's theme 'Benefit and Harm'. Participants were told to video record a story based on this theme. Various stories related to work and personal life were narrated. It gave an opportunity to reflect. This was a way of exploring emotions and actions.

With her immense experience and contribution in taking research ahead in India . She was the right person for the talk on "Ethical issues in stem cell research" After explaining the basic tenants of ethics madam highlighted the guidelines of ICMR research, basic concept of stem cell research, how it evolved, present scenario and its applications..She started her talk from the past to the present form of stem cells, types of stem cells, Categorization of stem cell based on the ethical and/or safety concerns regarding source of stem cells and levels of manipulation which warrant additional review and monitoring. The areas mainly are classified as Prohibited / Restrictive/ Permissible. She also emphasized the success rate of stem cells and how people should be alert about the false hope generated by advertisement, media and clinicians .engaged the audience with ethics in stem cell research in and interesting and thought-provoking speech. She discussed the various ethical issues related to stem cell research. She went on further to explain the monitoring mechanism of stem cell research in our country and globally. The address ended with risk benefit analysis.

❖ <u>Inarch Release:</u> The "Inarch" is annual bulletin of the unit released every year on world bioethics day. The articles are written by students and Bioethics wing members. Along with invited guest articles.








thanks. She specifically appreciated the student wing members' efforts in making the event successful.




















Dr Vasantha Muthuswamy (MBBS, MD, OBGY)
