

The twin institutes of the Seth GS Medical College & KEM Hospital were established in 1926 with a nationalistic spirit to cater to the “health care needs of the northern parts of the island” to be manned entirely by Indians. The glorious legacy now spans 100 years and these institutes are among the top ranked in the city and country with the Latin maxim “*Non Sibi Sed Omnibus- not for self but for all*”, embedded in every heart.

The centenary year (2025-2026) was marked by several achievements. We sent the first batch of three undergraduate students to UCLA, Los Angeles as part of an international exchange program. A memorandum of understanding has been signed with UMAAS, Boston for yet another undergraduate student exchange program planned for April 2026. Almost all departments held an alumni event bringing together the past, the present and future generations of their respective departments.

The institute started the city’s largest AI led clinical trial on the diagnosis of breast cancer and was awarded the best performing institute for the successful implementation of the Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Jan Arogya Yojana and Ayushman Bharat -Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana. A USG machine for fetal ultrasound was acquired through the rare diseases grant of the Govt of India. A high-tech sports medicine clinic was inaugurated, the first in a public hospital in Western India. The *Vina Shailesh Limdi Burn Care Center* unit was inaugurated that offers advanced, dignified burns management with intensive care capabilities, skin grafting and amniotic membrane harvesting. Construction is ongoing for a 21 storey residential tower and a new *Ayushman Shatabdi Tower* to alleviate space constraints and expand patient care services.

A glorious paradox of an educational institute is that while the alumni grow old, the Alma Mater grows, forever young. As the institute completes one hundred years of existence, it is hoped that these developments will constructively change the institutes for betterment of patients, greater efficiency of its enormous staff and help sounder training of its students and resident medical doctors, not to forget the support staff, nursing school and her alumni.

At the end of the day, as several thousand patients walk through these hallowed portals each year with hope in their hearts, it will remain our primary responsibility to ensure that they get the best medical care from kind, caring and compassionate physicians; hands that comfort, soothe and heal. As we march with quiet confidence and dignity into the next 100 years, here is hoping for another 100 years of excellence and a legacy of healing.

Achievements and Highlights

Anatomy

- Organized and Conducted MAHACON VII 2025, state level conference of Regional Chapter of Anatomy, Maharashtra under Anatomical Society of India at the institute on 21 and 22 February 2025.
- Organized Dr. Dhayagude drawing competition and Shirwalkar general proficiency scholarship examination in August.

Anesthesia

- Anesthesia given for successful hand transplantation in plastic surgery.
- One pediatric renal transplant (recipient age 5 yrs) was successfully performed
- Pediatric liver transplantation (recipient age 10years) successfully performed
- Two patients of obstetric hysterectomy with massive blood loss (approximately 25 liters) managed successfully in obstetric OT and AICU.
- Inauguration of “SKILL LAB” done on 15.12.25

Biochemistry

- 5th Certificate Course in “Clinical Laboratory Practices: A Quality Approach – Navigating Compliance and Quality in Clinical Laboratory” was conducted from 19th to 21st August 2025.
- CME on “Nutrition: Food as Medicine – Biochemical Link between Diet and Medicine” was held on 26th March 2025.

Cardiology

- Dissection & Mitra-Clip Procedure for Severe Mitral Regurgitation being the first among BMC hospitals.
- The year reached a distinguished conclusion with the Grand CARD KEM Centenary celebration, an event that brought together more than 80 eminent cardiology alumni from across the globe to honor the hospitals century-long legacy.

Cardiovascular and Thoracic Anesthesia

- Anaesthesia for several complex interventional procedures performed in
 - o Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory – Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement, RSOV closure, Transcatheter Pulmonary Valve Insertion, Tricuspid valve transcatheter interventions, pulmonary AV fistula closure and transcatheter pulmonary embolectomy, Mitra clip procedure, Aortic aneurysm coiling and stenting, aortic coarctation stenting, PDA device closure, Left ventricular aneurysm device closure, ASD device closure, VSD device closure, antenatal BMV.
 - o Pulmonary intervention – Distal bronchus foreign body removal, Tracheal dilation, Device closure for Broncho pleural Fistula, Bilateral Bronchial lavage done sequentially, EBUS.
 - o CVTS OT- CABG, Redo cardiac surgery, valvular heart surgery, aortic surgeries, congenital heart surgery, complex congenital pediatric surgery, Minimally invasive cardiac surgery - valve, congenital, CABG, flowing the enhanced recovery after cardiac surgery protocol and fast tracking in Cardiac Surgical ICU. - Ongoing study – Post market clinical follow up study of Cardiamed mechanical prosthetic valve.
- Completed study of FOLDAX Aortic Heart Valve - a biopolymer heart valve, as one of the centers participating in Foldex Trial- presently in Phase IV of trial.

- Regular use of Vascular Lab to train cardiac surgery residents.
- Endotrainer simulator added to vascular lab for training for MICS and VATS.
- Regular updation of educational Cardiac Surgery procedures on YouTube channel - PK SEN Department of CVTS
- Started ECMO program.

Clinical Hematology

- Started Multidisciplinary Clinic for persons with hemophilia
- The Department also runs international hemophilia training center and Comprehensive Hemophilia Care Center with 1415 patients of hemophilia registered in our institution for treatment.
- We have started prophylaxis to pediatrics patients and their parents have been trained to give factor infusion to their kids.
- Number of registered hemophilia patients are increased to 1415
- In day care more than 19000 patients are treated in the last 1 year.
- Around 280 Leukemia patients are diagnosed and treatment given in the last year
- Full time social worker and counselor in the dept from cankids organization to help the patients.
- Started treating of Primary Immunodeficiency under NPRD program.

Clinical Pharmacology

- Conducted a two-day workshop on Phase I study designs for the Indian Council of Medical Research on 31 Oct and 1 Nov 2025.
- Standardized HPLC method for simultaneous estimation of INH and Rifampicin for Therapeutic Drug Monitoring for patient care

Dermatology

- Motorized dermabrader: Primarily used for dermabrasion, a procedure done in acne scars, post-surgical scars, lichen amyloidosis, lichen simplex chronicus, post-injury/traumatic scars/scarring from accidents, burns, or other traumatic injuries.
- Surgical excision of xanthelasma on the eyelids
- Thermolysis for white hair removal.
- Intralesional radiofrequency ablation for hypertrophic port wine stain (capillary malformations).
- Intralesional vitamin c and tranexamic acid for melasma and perioribital hyperpigmentation.

Endocrinology

- Procured a state-of-the-art DEXA machine that can be used both for pediatrics and adults and that gives a trabecular bone score – first in Mumbai.

Medicine

Microbiology

- ICMR has granted sanction to establish an Infectious Disease Research and Diagnostic Laboratory (IRDL) under the “Expansion and strengthening of the existing Virus Research and Diagnostic Laboratory (VRDL)” in the Department of Microbiology, Seth G.S. Medical College and K.E.M Hospital, Mumbai.
- Microbiology successfully has undergone IRDL gap analysis visit as per the standard ISO 17025:2017 on 20th and 21st of November 2025.
- Successfully completed desktop assessment for renewal of NABL accreditation as per ISO 15189:2022 in April 2025.
- Successfully participated and cleared EQAS by national bodies for all the service divisions viz. bacteriology, mycobacteriology, mycology, molecular diagnosis, parasitology, serology, virology and immunology.
- Various audits pertaining to Infection Prevention and Control Practices were conducted including Hand Hygiene, BMW management and Device associated Infections (D.A. Is).
- The department is actively participating in implementing the NABH standards for infection control.
- Successful installation, implementation and functioning of HMIS in the department for OPD.

- Started with the process of certification of culture DST for Bedaquiline and Pretomanide as per NTEP guidelines.

- Mycobacteriology division of Department of Microbiology has been designated as a part of “ICMR- TB diagnostics validation center” by ICMR.
- VRDL division of Department of Microbiology has been designated and funded as an EQAS provider for Respiratory viruses (Sars CoV2 & Influenza) pan INDIA under the project ‘Enhancing Infectious Disease Diagnosis Quality: External Quality Assurance Program’ by ICMR.

Neonatology

- Continuation of provision of funds to the Comprehensive Lactation Management Centre at the department under National Health Mission.
- Inauguration of Comprehensive Lactation Management Centre by procuring new equipment, donated by Aarti foundation and increased manpower for the smooth functioning by NHM.
- Provision for nutritional supplements to mother in collaboration with Matruchhaya foundation.
- Neonatal resuscitation programme (NRP) for doctors from all over India under the guidance of Dr Anitha Haribalakrishna.
- Installation of SLE 6000 ventilator donated by Smt. Padmashri Anuradha Poudwal Madam, in the presence of Honorable Municipal Commissioner.
- Procurement through donation of level III radiant warmers and incubator.
- Procurement of Newborn Screening: Tandem Mass Spectrometry and Liquid Chromatography Mass Spectrometry under the aegis of Rare Disease Committee, KEM Hospital under the guidance of the dean, Dr Sangeeta Ravat.

Nephrology

- This year marks the third year of Dr VN Acharya glomerulonephritis registry, which was established in January 2023. It has enrolled 692 patients so far. The reports of this registry were presented at the World Congress of Nephrology at New Delhi, India, in February 2025.
- CAPD programme of home dialysis treatment was included in MPJAY government insurance scheme. This program has enrolled 72 patients till date.
- ICU dialysis facility is successfully running for critically ill patients in Medical Intensive Care Unit (MICU), CVTS ICU, SICU, Pediatric ICU, Respiratory ICU, and AICU.
- A ‘Hand Transplant’ team of KEM Hospital is now functional, in which department of nephrology is involved in pre-transplant assessment and post-transplant medical management, including immunosuppression regimen.
- Euroimmune Analyzer- I -2P - Automated ELISA reader, acquired in 2024, is well functional now and is used in research activities at present, and procedures for enabling timely investigations for patient care are underway.
- Nephrology lab successfully established and standardized evaluation of Urinary Calcium /creatinine ratio, urinary phosphorus, IDMS traceable creatinine estimation.
- Nephrology lab established testing for peritoneal dialysis adequacy, highly useful for the Chronic Ambulatory Peritoneal Dialysis program

Neurology

- The department runs a Comprehensive Epilepsy Care Centre in Collaboration with Neurosurgery, Neuropsychology, Psychiatry, Neuroradiology and Nuclear Medicine departments since 2001 and we have completed successfully 753 epilepsy surgeries till date.
- Enrolled 290 patients in memory clinic for dementia diagnosis and management

Neurosurgery

Various conferences and events conducted throughout the year:

- Hands on Microvascular Anastomosis in February 2025 in collaboration with department of anatomy.
- Department of Neurosurgery Centenary Alumni meet and Inauguration of “The Homi M Dastur Neurosurgical Society” on 28th June 2025.

- Neurovascon Cerebrovascular international conference was arranged from 26th to 28th September 2025 and attended by eminent Cerebrovascular and Endovascular faculty from all around the world.
- White fibre dissection workshop conducted on 5th September 2025 in collaboration with department of anatomy
- Hands on Microvascular Anastomosis and Aneurysm Clipping simulation workshop from 6th to 8th Nov 2025
- Neuronexus stroke management workshop for MBBS students carried out on 11th November 2025.

Obstetrics and Gynecology

- Resident as Teacher – MUHS sponsored Workshops conducted annually.
- Lactation Management Workshops integrated in PG teaching

Occupational Therapy

- The department specializes in helping patients regain functional independence in daily living activities after illness, injury, or disability. It caters to individuals across the lifespan, from pediatrics to geriatrics.
- Along with in-patient care, the department offers services to the outpatient departments catering to patients from different specialty areas like orthopedic, Psychiatry and Child Guidance Clinic, Learning Disabilities, Drug De-addiction, Cardiovascular and pulmonary; Plastic surgery; General Surgery, Diabetic, Endocrinology disorders and obesity; Neurological disorders, arthritis.
- Developmental Disabilities in children, Neonatology, Hematological conditions like Hemophilia, Hospice care in leukemia and Gerontology.
- Few of the tools for practice include splints, adaptive devices and orthoses prescription, fabrication, and checkout. Prosthesis prescription, Wheelchair prescription, mobility aids prescription and training, Recommendations for 'Access' in community, home and other areas, Assessment and intervention in 'Activities of daily living', disability calculation and assessment and assessment for Work Fitness's

Ophthalmology

- New services added - OCTA, Retcam POG, Tonometry, Optical biometry, ROP Screening with Laser, Renewal of Eye Bank.

Orthopedics

- Department of Orthopedics "In search of excellence" has protocolled the patient management in subspeciality of spinal surgery, arthroplasty and arthroscopy.
- Symposium on Ligament Injuries around Knee on 16 January 2025.

Pathology

- NABL Accreditation for Hematology / Clinical Pathology and Cytopathology laboratory
- Automated Laboratory information system for dispatch of printed reports of hematology
- Commencement of Immunofluorescence Microscopy for kidney biopsies
- Upgradation of Pathology class with mounting of specimens for teaching
- Upgradation & Automation of the Emergency Medical Laboratory Services, Surgical & Autopsy histopathology, Cytology, Hematology & Clinical Pathology and Out-patient Department for better services and timely delivery of reports.
- Regular weekly or monthly meetings with Clinical departments (Endocrinology, Gastroenterology, Nephrology & Obstetrics and Gynecology) for discussion of difficult and interesting cases to further knowledge and better patient care
- Continued participation in External Quality control program for Hematology with AIIMS Delhi and Cytopathology with Tata Memorial Hospital and Indian Academy of Cytologists (IAC)

Paediatrics

- 21 Syringe Infusion Pumps were procured for the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit through CSR
- Workshop organized by Department of Pediatrics, Seth GSMC & KEMH in collaboration with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) on 21.02.2025 on "Care for Rare" on the occasion of World Rare Disease Day.

Pediatric Anesthesia

- Child life therapy incorporated for perioperative care. This includes Music, Art and play therapy with children to relieve their anxiety pre and postoperatively.
- Department has started dry needling and Clostridium botulinum toxin injections in spastic cerebral palsy children as part of the chronic pain services.
- Clown services by Professional healthcare clown Monica Santos has been started for children in pain, palliative care and to allay preoperative anxiety.
- Clown services incorporated. Child life therapy started in MRI for preparation of children. Swaddle and sedate, a novel method of anesthetizing neonates and infants without general anesthesia has been adopted as per Great Ormond Street Hospital (GOSH) protocol.
- Certificates "Showing Incredible Bravery During the MRI" being issued to all children undergoing MRI scans.
- Continued involvement in intrathecal injection of the drug Spinraza in children with Spinal muscular atrophy as part of National project in conjunction with the Department of Paediatrics, KEM Mumbai.
- Use of USG guided regional blocks.
- Use of ultrasound incorporated for accurate placement of central lines, PICC and Groshong lines
- Increased use of microcuff endotracheal tubes down to neonates weighing more than 3 Kg
- Central Line, peripheral lines, USG guided venous access in difficult cannulations services continued in all pediatric wards and EPR to prevent catheter related bloodstream infection

Pediatric Surgery

- Mridula Rohatgi Oration was delivered by Dr. S. V. Parelkar during the 51st IAPSCON 2025 held in AIIMS Bhubaneswar.
- The Pediatric Surgery CME and Alumni Meet was conducted on 1 February 2025, and a Pediatric Surgery Meet with Cultural Programme for staff and support staff was held on 20 June 2025.

Pharmacology and Therapeutics

- Faculty members and postgraduate students bagged 7 awards for paper/ poster presentations and quiz at different national/regional conferences held this year.
- A total of 7 local workshops on GCP, research ethics, regulations in clinical trials, were conducted by the department.
- A national workshop covering various aspects of experimental and clinical pharmacology was conducted
- Faculty members also delivered lectures on various topics of ethics, research methodology in workshops conducted by MUHS, FERCI and other institutes.
- Faculty members of the department contributed as resource faculty in Medical Education Unit and conducted sessions at revised basic course in medical education, and Advanced course in medical education and FAIMER.
- The first prize for the A.S. Paranjpe intercollegiate quiz in pharmacology for II MBBS students was awarded to the team from Seth GS Medical college and KEM Hospital.

Physiology

- The department continued its strong contributions in academics, research, faculty development, and centenary-year institutional activities. Faculty were invited as guest speakers in Physiology, Medical Education, and Bioethics, and several staff actively participated in national workshops and conferences.

Physiotherapy

- Ph. D completion of Dr. Ujwal Yeole, MUHS under guidance of Dr Mariya Jiandani.

Plastic Surgery

- Renovation of the Burns Ward to now include 03 ICU cabins & also Male Patients.
- Tissue Bank at KEM - We have attended and counseled 90 amnion and 24 skin calls. A total of 29 amnions and 04 skins were harvested. The skin and amnion have benefitted 76 patients over the year (Jan 2025 to Nov 2025).
- 148 Patients benefitted under the MPJAY and PMJAY schemes in our department

Psychiatry

- Deaddiction Camp at Govandi for women ragpickers in association with “Stree Mukti Sangathana”
- Programme was held for caregivers on World Schizophrenia Day, where they were given information and guidance about this condition and caregiver burnout
- Programme for Caregivers on World Alzheimer’s Day and counselled them about handling this challenging condition, including easy-to-adapt routine and home modifications.

Clinical Hematology

- In a year, we usually see about 18500 patients on an outpatient basis and about 2000 – 2500 in hospital patients.
- This year we have seen around 35802 patients in OPD basis and day care basis.
- The Department of Hematology runs an outpatient clinic three times a week on Mondays and Thursdays from 9.30 to 1.30 and on Wednesday on 11th floor from 9.30 to 12.30 for follow up of CML and Aplastic anemia patients. During this period new patients are examined and investigated. Follow-up investigations of the old patients are also done.
- Patients requiring indoor admissions are admitted to Ward 42 on the 10th floor, New Multistory Building.
- We have an emergency service for bleeding disorder and hematological malignancies patients.
- New Hematology Day care has been renovated on the 11th floor new multistory building. Centre has been developed with the funding from the Natco trust. They have spent for the renovation, furniture and staff in the day care. The department runs a day care for patients to be given treatment on a day care basis.
- **In patient service:** Beds: Total - 25 [Allotted]. **Indoor Service:** Ward 42
- The department runs a day care, for patients to be given treatment on a day care basis. This includes patients of:
 - o Thalessemia for blood transfusions
 - o Bone marrow failure syndromes for blood & platelet transfusion
 - o Hemophilia's & other coagulation disorders for factor treatment and physical therapy
 - o Platelet disorders for transfusions
 - o Leukemias & lymphomas for chemotherapy, oral, I, V, & Intrathecal and Other hematological disorders

Neonatology

- **Inborn Unit:** Neonates born in K.E.M. Hospital are managed in this unit.
- **Inborn – Out born Unit:** Neonates in K.E.M. hospital at risk of infection and neonates transferred from other municipal or private hospitals are managed here.
- **Transitional Care Unit:** This section renders transitional convalescent care to neonates once the acute stage of disease is managed in intensive care units. The babies who do not require close and continuous monitoring are looked after here.
- **Ventilation Unit:** The babies requiring advanced ventilatory care are closely monitored and managed here.
- **Palliative Care Unit:** Very sick babies who are nursed in any of the above sections are given supportive care, psychological counselling, and social support.
- **Comprehensive Lactation Management Centre:** Human milk bank is an institution established for the purpose of collecting, screening processing, storing & distributing donated human milk that is dispensed to recipients who are not the biological off springs of the donor mother.
- **Kangaroo Mother Care Center:** The department is selected as the center of excellence in India for initiating Kangaroo Mother Care for low-birth-weight babies. Kangaroo Mother Care Center is the first & the only of its kind in the country. Neonates, recipients of KMC, are regularly followed up here for growth, nutritional status, neuromotor, neuro developmental & neurosensory assessment & early intervention therapy is instituted whenever required.
- **Neonatal Intensive Care Unit:** 47 Beds.

Pediatric Anesthesia

- The department caters to 3 operation theatre tables located in Paediatric OT complex. Anaesthesia services were given to about 800 surgical patients & the department catered to 3000 Anaesthesia OPD patients for pre-operative evaluation.
- In addition the department provides care and cover for sick children in the Paediatric Surgery 3ICU, along with anaesthesia services for children in remote locations such as Ophthalmology (55 cases), Gastroenterology (342 cases), MRI (286 cases), and CT scan(34 cases), Pediatric Orthopedics (36 cases).
- Aid the Paediatric department in securing difficult intravenous access via USG guided central/peripheral route (255 lines).
- Use of real time ultrasound has been extended beyond regional and vascular access to include airway assessment, 2D Echo as well as abdominal and lung assessment.
- Increased use of target controlled infusion (TCI) for delivery of total intravenous anaesthesia in Anesthesia services have started in MRI.
- Use of target Controlled Infusions (TCI) newer models Eleved for Propofol and Minto for Remifentanyl have been started after receiving a grant from Sanyog Trust for procuring the Medcaptain TCI pump.
- Pediatric Pain Clinic has taken on in full force. Services given to Spastic cerebral palsy children for dry needling and Clostridium Botulinum toxin injections. This has shown remarkable results along with physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy for the management of these children. Dr Lakshmi Vas Honorary Consultant in Pediatric Pain and Dr Raylene Dias have started this service newly in the Centenary Year.

Plastic Surgery

Surgical Gastroenterology

Transfusion Medicine

- > Hand transplant is a treatment for people who have had one or both hands amputated
- > The first hand transplant in India was conducted in 2015
- > In Mumbai, train accident victim Monika More became the first hand transplant recipient in 2020
- > Since then, 26 hands have been transplanted in Mumbai
- > 24 transplants were conducted in GlenEagles Hospital, Parel
- > The civic-run KEM Hospital has conducted two so far
- > The cost remains a major limiting factor, beginning with expensive surgery followed by lifelong immunosuppression
- > In Indian private hospitals, bilateral hand transplants cost between ₹15L and ₹30L

- Education: We wish to develop E-learning simulated labs with hi-tech programs for learning and education. We also wish to start an integrated Masters Program and Short Certificate Courses at the University Level.
- Research: We look forward to collecting data for standardizing scales on the Indian population in different fields of Occupational Therapy for the purpose of assessment & intervention.
- Campus and Infrastructure: Renovation of the department portraying the specialty areas developed in the past years, incorporating the facility of internet and intranet at Occupational Therapy Department.
- Department is also working on having its own Activities Of Daily Living room for training patients in cognitive and physical rehabilitation at home. Adaptive devices and home modifications will be incorporated in the specified area to guide and train patients for actual training.
- Department is also working on having its own Work Rehabilitation Unit for training patients with compromised working abilities. We will soon having high tech driver simulation and work hardening facility for the various indoor and outdoor jobs.

Ophthalmology

- The Department of Ophthalmology is planning to work ahead with advanced ophthalmic technologies to enhance patient care, academic training, and surgical outcomes.
- The department proposes the introduction of 3D visualization-assisted ophthalmic surgeries along with high-definition video conferencing facilities for live surgical demonstrations and academic interactions.

KEMHICC was pro-active in identifying and implementing measures for IPC such as Outbreak investigations, Monitoring and Surveillance for healthcare associated infections as listed below :

- CVTS OT complex was visited and AHU and vents inspected. Environmental samples collected including exposure plates. Findings were shared with the department and corrective action taken.
- Dr.Chaya A. Kumar (HIC convenor) & Dr.Shreeraj (ICO) discussed and gave training to the CVTS OT faculty and staff on the protocols to be followed in the CVTS OT.
- Paediatric surgery ward and ICU (Ward no 3 & IPCU) was visited. Dr Shreeraj conducted a training on “Scrub the Hub”. The housekeeping staff were adviced to follow instructions on label of disinfectant while preparing working solution. Emphasized that ICUs requires increased concentration of disinfectant.
- Dr Shreeraj (ICO) and Mrs.Anuja (ICN) visited NICU in view of increase in the isolation rates of drug resistant pathogens. Measures were suggested to reduce the same by practicing enhanced and supervised environmental disinfection, asepsis and hand hygiene.
- The Infection Control Team visited under construction CVTS-OT for inspecting the work and IPC related inputs given to the contractor.
- Advise on continued use or shutting down of operation theatres based on the surveillance results was undertaken.
- Inputs given to Anaesthesia dept regarding use of ventilator circuits on Covid positive patients.
- OT guidelines and inputs given to Ophthalmology dept in view of 2 weekly cataract surgery campaign.
- MRSA screening of HCWs was carried out in those department / departments where increased SSI due to drug resistant pathogen/s in that particular unit was observed. HCWs found to be colonized with MRSA were recommended decolonization and repeat nasal swab to test negative before resuming surgical procedures.
- The Infection Control Team took Swacchta Pathwada 2025 rounds of wards for general cleanliness and segregation of dry and wet waste alongwith Deputy dean, Assistant dean and ORM.
- Needle stick injuries to HCWs were monitored.

Medical College and K.E.M. Hospital, Mumbai, India. The journal is published by Wolters Kluwer India Private Limited. The journal does not charge the Authors or Authors' institutions for the submission, processing and/or publications of manuscripts. The Journal charges a nominal fee for color reproduction of colored images/photographs/figures and (optional charges) for making the articles open access for the readers. JPGM promotes published papers by electronically supplying the records to the National Library of Medicine at the time of online publication, making it sure that the citations are retrievable from MEDLINE as early as possible. Similarly, the citations in MEDLINE are cross-linked from the official site of MEDLINE to the journal's site, thus the readership of published articles is increased many folds. The journal is registered with the following abstracting partners: Baidu Scholar, CNKI (China National Knowledge Infrastructure), EBSCO Publishing's Electronic Databases, Ex Libris – Primo Central, Google Scholar, Hinari, Infotrieve, National Science Library, ProQuest, TdNet, and Wanfang Data. The journal is indexed with, or included in, the following: DOAJ, EMBASE/ Excerpta Medica, Emerging Sources Citation Index, Indian Science Abstracts, IndMed, MEDLINE/Index Medicus, PubMed Central, Scimago Journal Ranking, SCOPUS, Science Citation Index Expanded, and Web of Science. Currently the journal is in its 71st year of being published. Impact Factor® as reported in the 2024 Journal Citation Reports® (Clarivate Analytics, 2025) is 1.2 and the 5-year impact factor is 1.7. Journal of Postgraduate Medicine has h-index of 64, meaning that 64 articles of this journal have more than 64 numbers of citations. It was established under the aegis of the Central Sector Scheme of the Department of Health Research (DHR), Government of India for the development of infrastructure for promotion of health research in different areas of non-communicable diseases. The unit received funding from DHR in September 2014 and started functioning from June 2016.

Mandate:

- To encourage and strengthen an environment of research in non-communicable diseases (NCD).
- To bridge the gap in the infrastructure which is inhibiting health research

- To improve the overall health status by creating evidence-based application of diagnostic procedures/processes.
- The GSMC-MRU is headed by Dr. Sangeeta Ravat, Dean (G&K). Dr. Sandhya Kamat, Professor & Head, Department of Pharmacology & Therapeutics is the Nodal officer. The scientific and technical work at MRU is managed by 2 research scientists, 2 lab technicians and 1 lab assistant cum data entry operator. The overall management of the unit is done as per the recommendations of the Executive Committee (EC), the Local Research Advisory Committee (LRAC) and the Purchase committee (PC). The LRAC has been formed as per ICMR requirement and has 5 external and 3 internal members from various specialties as recommended by ICMR.

A. Clinical Dietetic Service



Sr citizen gets ₹9L gift from KEM: A clip for leaky heart valve

AN IMPLANT FOR MITRAL VALVE



Mumbai: For a 66-year-old grandmother from Latur who was breathing with difficulty for almost six months, doctors at the civic-run KEM Hospital had a surprise gift. A Rs 15-lakh new device to fix the leaking mitral valve causing her symptoms. The mitral valve is one of the four that regulates the flow of blood from the left atrium to the left ventricle. In this procedure, doctors access the mitral valve with a thin tube (catheter) that is guided through a vein in the leg to reach the heart. A small implant is attached to the mitral valve to help it close more completely. This procedure is less invasive than open-heart surgery, which was done to fix the leaky valve. In the last few years, the device has been used to treat patients with a leaking mitral valve who were not fit for open-heart surgery. The patient was initially advised surgery, but it was risky due to her age and comorbidities. In the minimally invasive method, a clip-like device was inserted via a catheter, avoiding the need for surgery, Dr Mahajan explained. The KEM Hospital team got the made-in-India device for registration. The 66-year-old patient suffered a heart attack a few months back and underwent angioplasty at a local hospital. "She initially improved but began experiencing breathlessness on exertion within a few months due to a leaking mitral valve—a known complication of heart attacks," said Dr Mahajan.

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
